Coalville Belvoir Rotary Club smashes previous year's best after raising impressive sum from Santa Sleigh trips

Coalville Belvoir Rotary Club has announced it has raised £3,600 from its Christmas fundraising activities.

The money will be used to help local charities - and has beaten last year's total.

There are three local charities, which will get £1,200 each - they are Brown Dog Cancer Charity, Love4Life, and LAMP.

The Brown Dog Cancer Charity, based in Coalville, raises money to purchase vital equipment and infrastructure to improve the detection and treatment of cancer.

Every year, the charity selects projects aimed at improving the lives of individuals, both young and old, grappling with cancer and the challenges it poses for them and their families.

Love4Life provides fantastic support to empower young people aged 11-18 to build confidence and make positive choices in their health, relationships and education. Set up in 2008, Love4Life has grown to work across multiple areas of deprivation in Leicestershire, Leicester and Derby, supporting hundreds of young people every year.

LAMP, which stands for <u>Leicestershire Action for Mental Health Project</u>, is all about supporting people in our community who need help with mental health. They're independent, which means they can focus on what each person really needs—whether it's care and support, questioning decisions about their care, taking care of someone with mental health issues, or just being worried about a family member, colleague, or friend.



A Rotary spokesperson said: "This isn't just about giving money; it's about making people happy, especially children - and adults - who got to meet Santa. A big thank you to everyone who donated money or just stopped by to say hello to our collectors."
