Have you been down to the Belvoir Centre recently? If not, you're in for a beautiful surprise. Please take a minute to look across to the grassed area, you'll be greeted by an array of wonderful purple crocuses.

Cast your mind back to a cold Sunday morning in October when you may have seen 4, slightly frozen individuals planting bulbs. Many hours and blisters later, 600 purple crocus bulbs were in and planted. Thus, creating the stunning display you will see before you. For those of you into your horticulture, they are the Ruby Giant variety. You may be asking why? The purple crocus is a symbol of Rotary's worldwide campaign to eradicate polio. The purple represents the dye used to mark the finger of a child who has been immunised. A lifesaving oral polio vaccine costs a mere 20p! Polio is a paralysing and potentially fatal disease, striking people of any age but mainly those under five. Polio can be prevented through vaccination. For over thirty years, Rotary has worked on trying to rid the world of Polio. When Rotary started the campaign, there were cases in 125 countries. Today, we have helped to reduce polio cases by 99.9% with only two countries reporting cases of wild poliovirus. Due to the efforts of Rotary and their partners, it is estimated that 1.5 million deaths have been prevented and 19.4 million people have been saved from paralysis. This infrastructure is also being used to treat and prevent other diseases such as COVID-19.

Rotary members have contributed countless hours to protect nearly 3 billion children. The funds you help us raise provide much needed operational support, medical workers, laboratory equipment and educational materials.

Coalville Belvoir Rotary Club is inviting local schools to take part in a Walk a Mile to End Polio event next month.

The event is being organised to mark World Polio Day on October 24 - with the aim of increasing community spirit, exercise and raising awareness about polio.

It is also to raise funds to help Rotary complete its mission to eradicate polio worldwide.

Polio is a virus that causes paralysis and, potentially, death but can be prevented by simple immunisation.

Rotary's mission to eradicate polio worldwide is almost a reality as currently, there are only a handful of cases left in Afghanistan and Pakistan.

This is also the 90th year of Rotary in Coalville.

And, since receiving its charter in 1933, members have done much to help the local community.

In 1984, a clock was donated to the town of Coalville to celebrate the club's golden jubilee and can still be seen today outside the council offices.

Over the decades the club has met in various places in and around Coalville; The Railway in the 1950s, The Belfry/Charnwood Towers (now St Joseph's Tearoom) in the 60s, The Fox & Goose in the 70s, the Bardon Hotel/Charnwood Arms in the 80s, the Hermitage Park Hotel from the 90s and currently at Coalville CAN Headquarters.



If anyone has any further information about the club's history, in particular prior to the 50s, then please get in touch with the officials. August was a busy month for Coalville Belvoir Rotary Club, culminating in Dave's Tractor Run on the 20th. Despite it clashing with the Lionesses' World Cup Final against Spain, the crowd came out to see the tractors go by on their way to lbstock Country Fair - and over £550 was raised for the local charity Wishes 4 Kids. The club would like to say thank-you to Secure-a-Field Fencing Access Solutions, Sharnford Tractors, Cooks Midlands Ltd., Home Farm Heritage, Startin Tractors Ltd and Moulton Farm Machinery Ltd., without whose sponsorship the event would not have been possible. For the first time, the President of Coalville Belvoir Rotary Club, Simon Guile, assisted by Dave Moulton's grandson, Jacob, selected a tractor to receive a trophy for 'Best Tractor'. The winner was David Vernon with his tractor, a 1952 Little Grey Fergie. The club is currently busy in the background planning its Christmas Santa collections, with this year's proceeds going to the following three charities: 1. LAMP (Leicestershire Action for Mental Health Project) which provides independent community mental health advocacy to the people of Leicester, Leicestershire and Rutland, including support to families and carers.

3. The Brown Dog Cancer Charity - Raise money to purchase vital equipment or infrastructure to improve the detection or treatment of cancer.

Local Rotary Clubs support National Rotary KidsOut Day with pupils from Coalville school

As in previous years, the local Rotary Clubs of Ashby de la Zouch, Ashby Castle, Ashby Hasting and Coalville Belvoir joined forces to support KidsOut.

Last Wednesday (September 20) the clubs took around 50 children from Forest Way School on a trip to Twycross Zoo, with Rotary covering the cost of the transport and entry fee.

Four classes from Forest Way School came along, with members from each Rotary Club supporting staff from a different class.

They headed off in various directions and the children were excited - despite the heavy rain - to see the many different animals including zebras, rhinos and giraffes.

The meerkats huddled under their red-light heater and the giant tortoises in their warm enclosure were particular favourites.

Walking towards the gibbon house, one of the teachers (mentioning no names!) lost her cap when it blew in to the enclosure. We had a brief delay while a friendly zookeeper rescued the cap. Luckily, this gave the class a chance to view the cutest baby gibbon, just three weeks old, swinging around clinging to their mum.

At lunchtime, the ice creams provided by Rotary were a big hit with the children, and most of the adults too.

Seeing the snow leopard prowl around outside the canteen was a highlight for many of the group.

The group then headed back out and asked the children which animals they still wanted to see.

The flamingos and penguins were a popular choice and we just had time to see all the animals requested by the group before returning to the coaches.

The children were well behaved, and all involved enjoyed the day.

The first National Rotary KidsOut Day took place in 1990 and since then it has turned into the biggest single outing for disadvantaged children in the UK.

With more than 18,000 children participating in 2023, the National Day Out is run in conjunction with Rotary International in Great Britain and Ireland with more than 10,000 Rotarians volunteering their help at over 100 venues.

Whether they live with critical health issues, in refuge or with a disability, children across the country are taken on a fun day out to the zoo, a theme park or even the seaside, often for the first time in their lives.
